The Pastor's Page

Years ago, as a child, I participated in something my congregation had put together: a Seder meal. If you're unfamiliar with it, the Seder is the modern Jewish Passover meal. Our congregation, like many LCMS congregations, had decided that hosting a Seder during Holy Week would be a meaningful way to remember the Last Supper. I was fairly young at the time, but I still remember it being a very somber, reverent occasion.

Over my ministry, I've been asked by parishioners at various times about whether I would ever host a Seder. Years ago, my reaction to such an idea was more positive. After all, it's a pretty common practice in LCMS congregations. The congregation I grew up in had done it. Why not? But as I studied and considered the idea further, I realized it probably wasn't the best practice for several reasons.

First, it's important to realize that the modern Seder is not the same thing as the Passover meal that Jesus and the disciples celebrated, nor the same Passover meal that was instituted and practiced by the Israelites throughout the Old Testament. The modern Jewish Seder developed centuries after Christ, especially after the destruction of the temple in 70 A.D. The elements and structure of today's Seder differ from what Jesus observed. So, attempts to "recreate" the Last Supper using a modern Seder are simply inaccurate and more than a little misleading.

Second, we need to understand that Christ has fulfilled the Passover. Jesus did not merely modify the Passover when he gave us the Lord's Supper: He brought it to completion. The Lord's Supper is not just a meal of remembrance but a means of grace where Christ gives us His true body and blood for the forgiveness of sins.

Christ himself is the fulfillment of the Passover lamb. The blood of Christ is the blood of the lamb, spread

on the doorposts, to protect us from God's wrath. Christ himself is the unleavened bread, promising freedom from slavery to sin, death, and the devil. So, trying to continue a form of the Passover after its fulfillment is really just clinging to the shadow rather than the reality.

Third, and this applies to participating in any festival of the Old Testament, we need to remember that the Passover was part of the Old Covenant, based on law and obligation. The Lord's Supper belongs to the New Covenant, centered on the Gospel: God's free gift of grace in Christ. The Seder is a meal of instruction and remembrance, but it does not offer Christ's real presence or the forgiveness of sins.

Now, I want to make it clear that I am not condemning fellow Christians or LCMS congregations who choose to take part in a Seder. It's not a sinful practice. And if you participated in one and found in helpful, I'm happy for you. I just think it has the potential to be misleading or distracting.

Instead of looking to the Seder to remember the Last Supper, I'd much rather embrace the meal Christ has given: The Lord's Supper. Unlike the Seder, which only recalls the past, the Lord's Supper is a present reality in which Christ is truly present. In this Sacrament, we receive His body and blood for the forgiveness of sins, strengthening our faith and uniting us as the Church.

In truth, the Church does not need additional rituals to remember the Passover or the Last Supper. We have been given the greater meal—the Lord's Supper—where Christ Himself comes to us. Instead of seeking to understand the Passover through a Seder, we should look to the Lord's Table, where the true fulfillment of the Passover is given to us in Christ's body and blood.

This is how our Lord has commanded us to remember Him. This is how we receive His gifts of grace.

This is how we participate in the fulfillment of all that the Old Testament promised. The Jews can have their Seder and remember the past in ignorance. I would much rather embrace the present joy of Christ coming to me for the forgiveness of all my sins.

March 18, 2025

Call to Order: Vice President Jason Linneman called the meeting to order.

Opening Prayer: Pastor Ketelsen opened the meeting with prayer.

Acceptance/Amendments of Agenda: With no amendments offered, the agenda is accepted as presented.

Approve Minutes of January 21, 2024: Sharon Strough motions to approve the minutes of January 21; Kim Toellner seconds the motion. The motion carries.

Pastor's Report:

- Lent has begun; midweek services are underway and going well; Pastor is working on some potential live music for Easter service.
- b. Pastor will be on vacation May 17 25.
- A meeting of the Missouri Action Advisory
 Group (MAAG) will convene on March 23 in
 Ashland; Pastor and Craig Meyer will attend.

Reports of Officers:

- a. **President's Report:** Not present; no report.
- b. Vice President's Report: No report.
- c. Secretary's Report: No report.
- d. Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Kim Toellner presents a written report including the Balance Sheet, Profit and Loss Statement and Expense report; the information is reviewed and discussed.
