The Pastor's Page

I've been doing a fair amount of premarital counseling recently and, as part of that counseling, I do a brief Bible study on the topics of love and marriage in the Bible. And during that Bible study, I always make a statement that sounds a bit odd to American ears: Love can be commanded.

We don't typically think about love in those terms. To the average American, love is a mystical emotion. A warm, fuzzy feeling that is beyond our control. But that's not at all how Jesus talks about love. For Jesus, love is a command.

"Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" A Pharisee once asked Jesus. And what did Jesus reply? "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets."

Love can be commanded. In fact, love is commanded. We are commanded to love God. We are commanded to love our neighbor. Which means that, for sinful human beings, love is not Gospel. It is Law. Love is the entire Law and the entire Law is about love.

It's not that way for God. For God, love is Gospel. Why? Because God has no obligation to love us. We are sinners. He is not. He can show nothing but anger and judgment to us and still be completely righteous for doing so. For God to show us any amount of grace, mercy, or compassion is withholding wrath that we deserve. God's love for us is pure gospel. But our love for God and our neighbor? That's Law.

In marriage, this is most evident in obeying the 6th commandment: You shall not commit adultery. When a husband and wife remain faithful to each other for long as they both shall live, they do so in obedience to the 6th commandment. But in obeying the 6th commandment, they are also showing love for each other. Because love, like the 6th commandment, can be commanded.

But this shows up in many other facets of our lives. One of the most interesting, to me, is the topic of civics and government. Did you know it is the God given duty and authority of the government to enforce your love for your neighbor? Let me explain.

In Romans 13, Paul commands us to be subject to the governing authorities. He tells us that these authorities have been instituted by God and that anyone who resists the authority of the government is resisting the authority of God himself and will receive God's judgement for that resistance.

In short, the governing authorities are an extension of God's authority in the civil realm. They are one of many ways that we feel the first use of the law in our lives, for they exist to curb our sinful behavior, particularly when it comes to how we interact with our neighbor in the city, state, and nation around us. So when a person is arrested, tried, and convicted of murder, the governing authorities are enforcing the 5th commandment. When a person is arrested, tried, and convicted of theft, the governing authorities are enforcing the 7th commandment, and so on.

But here's the thing: those commandments exist as part of Jesus' command to love your neighbor. The

government is simply enforcing that commandment in accord with God's purposes for it. That is why God puts every governing authority on earth. As Paul says, the government exists to bear the sword for our good.

That's something that is often lost in our understanding of civil government today, especially by Christians. The church is fundamentally a place of Gospel. Yes, we apply the Law when we need to, convicting people of sin. But our ultimate goal is always to proclaim God's forgiveness. And, as a result, we are Gospel-minded people, seeking to forgive as we have been forgiven. That's a good thing.

But the government is fundamentally not a place of Gospel. It is a place of Law. A place where evildoers should feel terror for the sins they have committed and the sword should be used to bring judgement on the criminal and justice to the oppressed.

Can the government show grace? Yes, at times. The government's ultimate goal, after all, is justice and the good of those it governs. And so, on rare occasions, there may be circumstances where the best, most just thing to do is to show a measure of grace. It happens. But it is not the norm.

It's important to remember that when evaluating the competency of the governing authorities. A government that acts like the Church is probably not doing its job, just as a church that acts like the government is probably not doing its job. We each have a role in God's kingdom. Roles that are opposite, in many ways, yet complementary. Serving together under Christ's authority to bring Law and Gospel to a world that needs both.
