

The Pastor's Page

At a recent circuit meeting, the LCMS pastor of the region got together and began a new study of the Smalcald Articles. Among the various documents of the Lutheran confessions, the Smalcald Articles aren't quite as well known as, say, the Augsburg Confession or the catechisms. But they were an important document, none the less.

And as we dove into the historical background of this document, we were reminded that Martin Luther himself included the Smalcald Articles in his will as his personal statement of faith. Likewise, his prince at the time, John Frederick, did the same. Both men wanted their heirs and the generations to come to know what they believed, taught, and confessed in Christ.

That raised a good question for us: Have you considered including a confession of faith in your will? We often call it a "last will and testament." The word 'testament' is about giving testimony, and in earlier centuries it was common for Christians to include a statement of faith in their wills. Today, our wills typically deal with earthly possessions, but they can also bear witness to what is most valuable: your trust in Jesus Christ.

Why would you want to do this? Well, first, such a statement gives you the opportunity to make a public confession of faith even after your death. When your children, grandchildren, or great-grandchildren read your words, they will know that Christ was at the center of your life. They will not have to wonder what mattered most to you. Your confession can continue to teach, encourage, and bear witness long after you are gone. Luther's testimony in the Smalcald Articles continues to strengthen Christians nearly five hundred years later.

Your words, though perhaps brief and simple, could do the same within your own family.

Second, a statement of faith in your will offers a word of comfort to those who mourn. Death is hard and grief is real. Yet your words can remind your loved ones that you died in the Lord. They can read in your own handwriting that you trusted Christ for forgiveness, life, and salvation. In that moment, when their hearts are weighed down by loss, your confession can point them to the risen Christ, who has overcome death and opened the way of eternal life. What a powerful gift it would be for your children to hear you say, even after your passing, that you died with Christ on your lips and with the sure and certain hope of the resurrection in your heart.

Third, such a statement brings clarity about your funeral and ensures that the service reflects your faith. Not every family member may share your confession, and in moments of grief, decisions can be difficult. But your testimony can make it plain: you want a funeral centered not on sentiment, but on Christ crucified and risen. You want hymns that proclaim the Gospel, Scripture readings that point to the resurrection, and a service that comforts the mourners with God's promises. By stating this clearly, you not only guard your funeral against confusion, but you also use that final occasion to confess Christ one more time.

This is not a requirement, but it is a powerful opportunity. Just as Luther's words continue to echo down to us centuries later, so your confession of Christ could echo to your children and grandchildren after you. As the psalmist says, "I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the Lord" (Psalm 118:17).

Perhaps consider taking time to write such a statement. It doesn't need to be long—just a simple testimony of the Gospel that carried you through life. In doing so, you will leave behind not only an inheritance of earthly goods, but also a lasting legacy of faith in Christ.

Call to Order: President Gene Cummins called the meeting to order.

Opening Prayer: Pastor Ketelsen opened the meeting with prayer.

Acceptance/Amendments of Agenda: A personnel topic was added for discussion. Agenda accepted with amendment.

Approve Minutes of June 17, 2025: Gayle Linneman motions to approve the minutes of the June 17 council meeting; Gaven Linneman seconds. The motion carries.

Pastor's Report: Pastor Ketelsen reports that he continues to prepare for VBS, a new member class and confirmation classes.

Reports of Officers:

a. **President's Report:** No report.

c. Secretary's Report: No report.

- d. **Treasurer's Report:** Treasurer Kim Toellner presents a verbal report:
 - She had a conference call with a BTC
 Bank representative to discuss moving
 accounts; after council discussion, the
 accounts will remain with Southern
 Bank.
 - ii. One half of the school liability owed to the general account has been paid.
 - iii. Following up on a previous inquiry, Kim determined the 'Accounts Receivable Employees' line item on the Balance Sheet reflects Pastor's note payback.

- f. **Board of Property:** Chair Darren Linneman not present.

They came to Wonder Junction to learn the wonder of Jesus birth, His Childhood (Jesus at the Temple), His Ministry years (Jesus does Wondrous Things), His death & resurrection and the Wonder of His Return. They learned the lessons through songs (Toe Tappin' Tunes), crafts and lesson time. They were introduced to animals Cougar Kitten (just like Cougar Kitten, Jesus needed to be fed and cared for too!) Wolf Pup (Jesus had to learn things while he was growing up, just like Wolf Pup did). Bison reminded us how Powerful he was, but as powerful as Bison was Jesus was more powerful.
